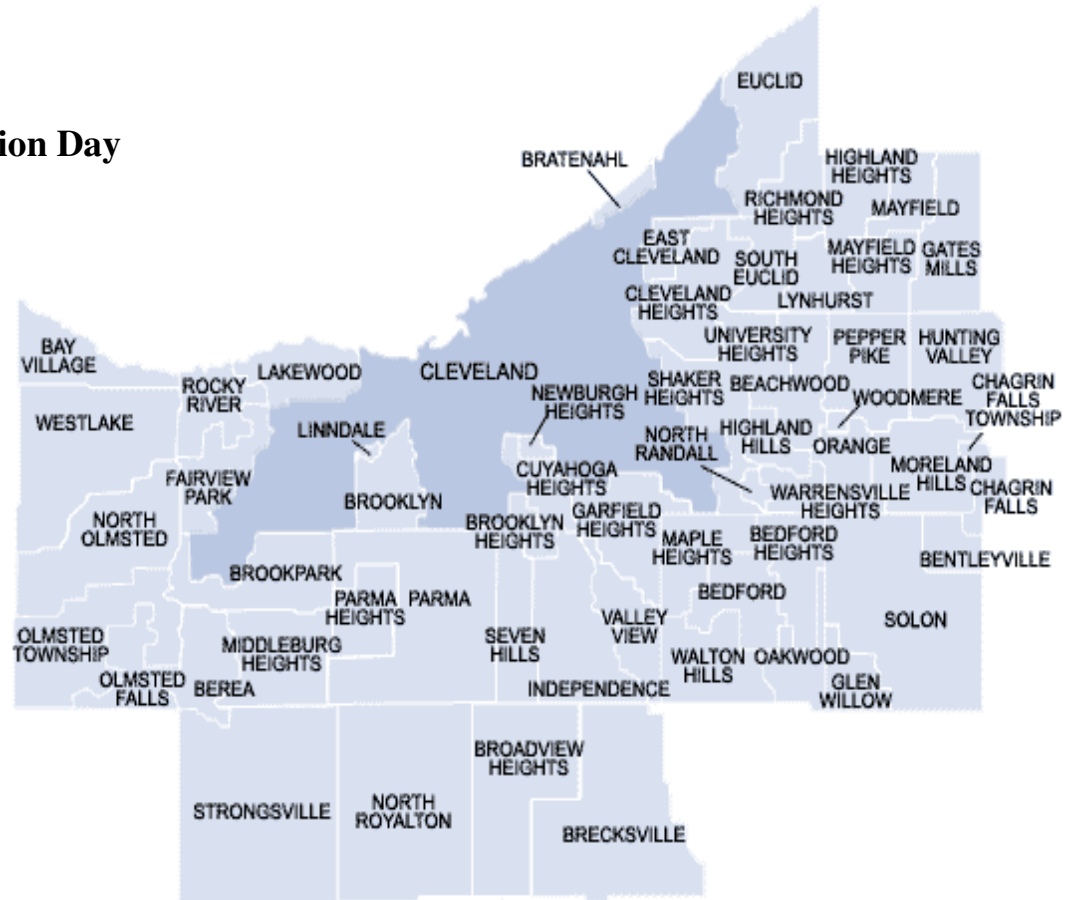

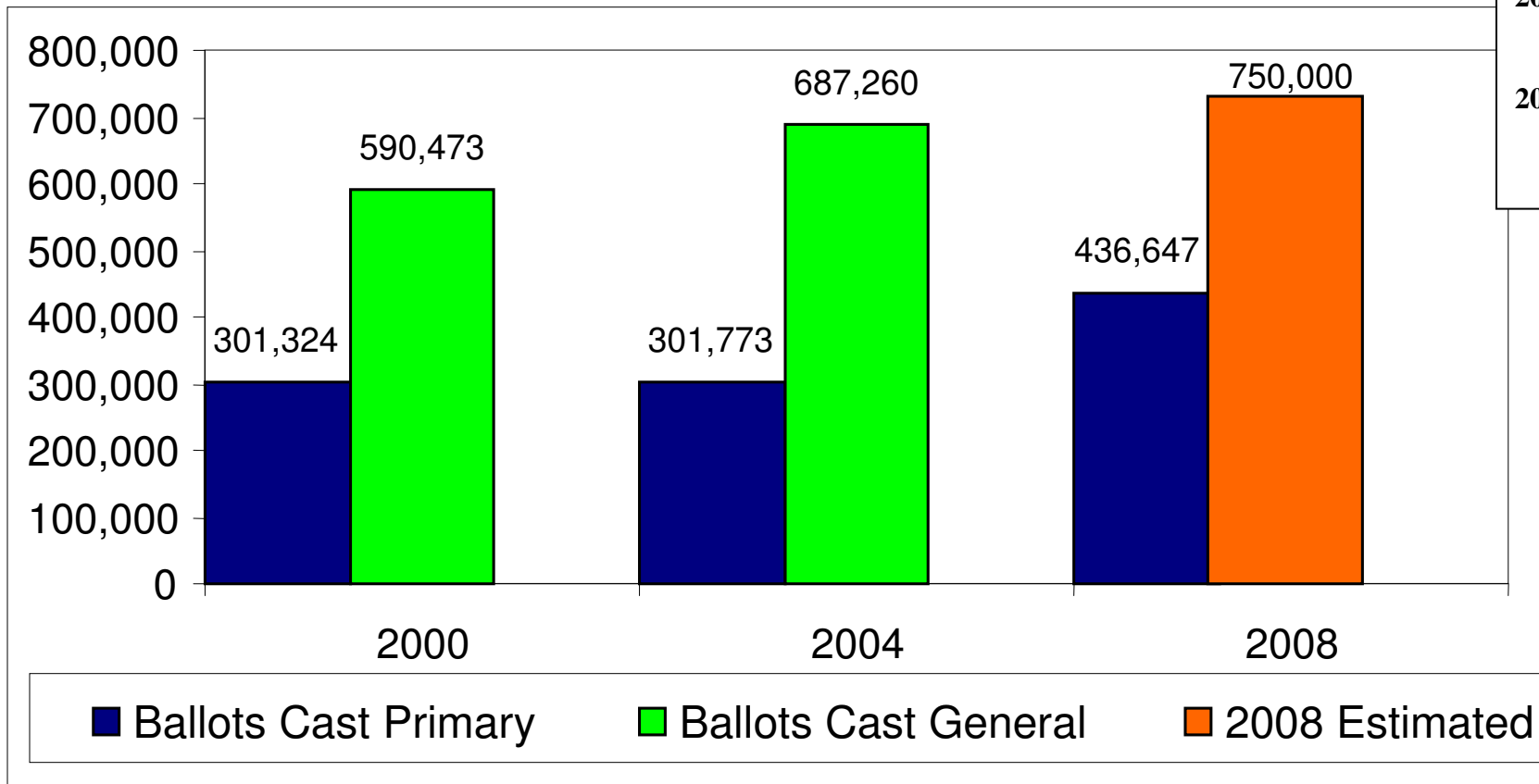

2008:	Primary 41 % General 71 % (Estimated)

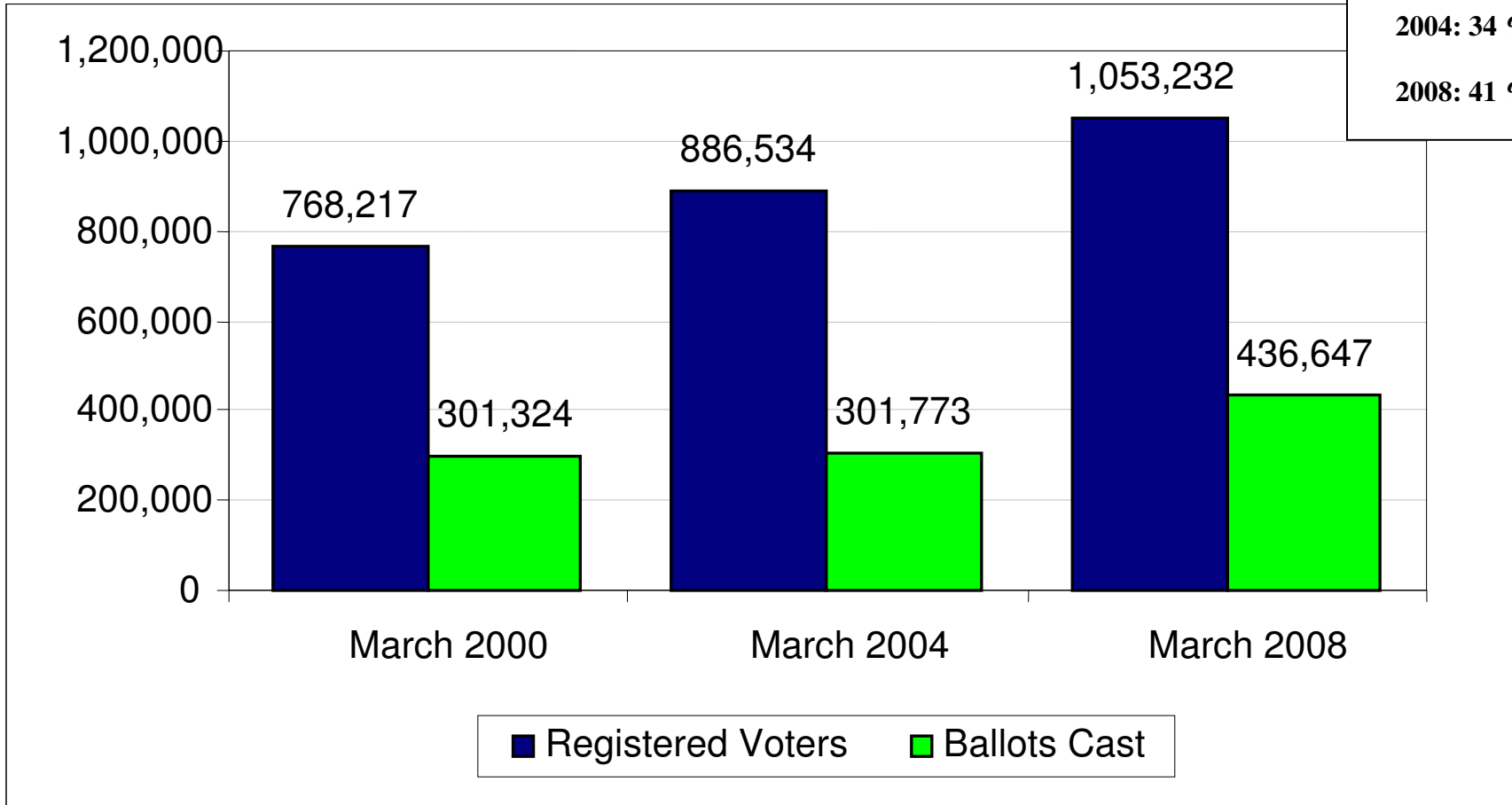

2008:	41 %



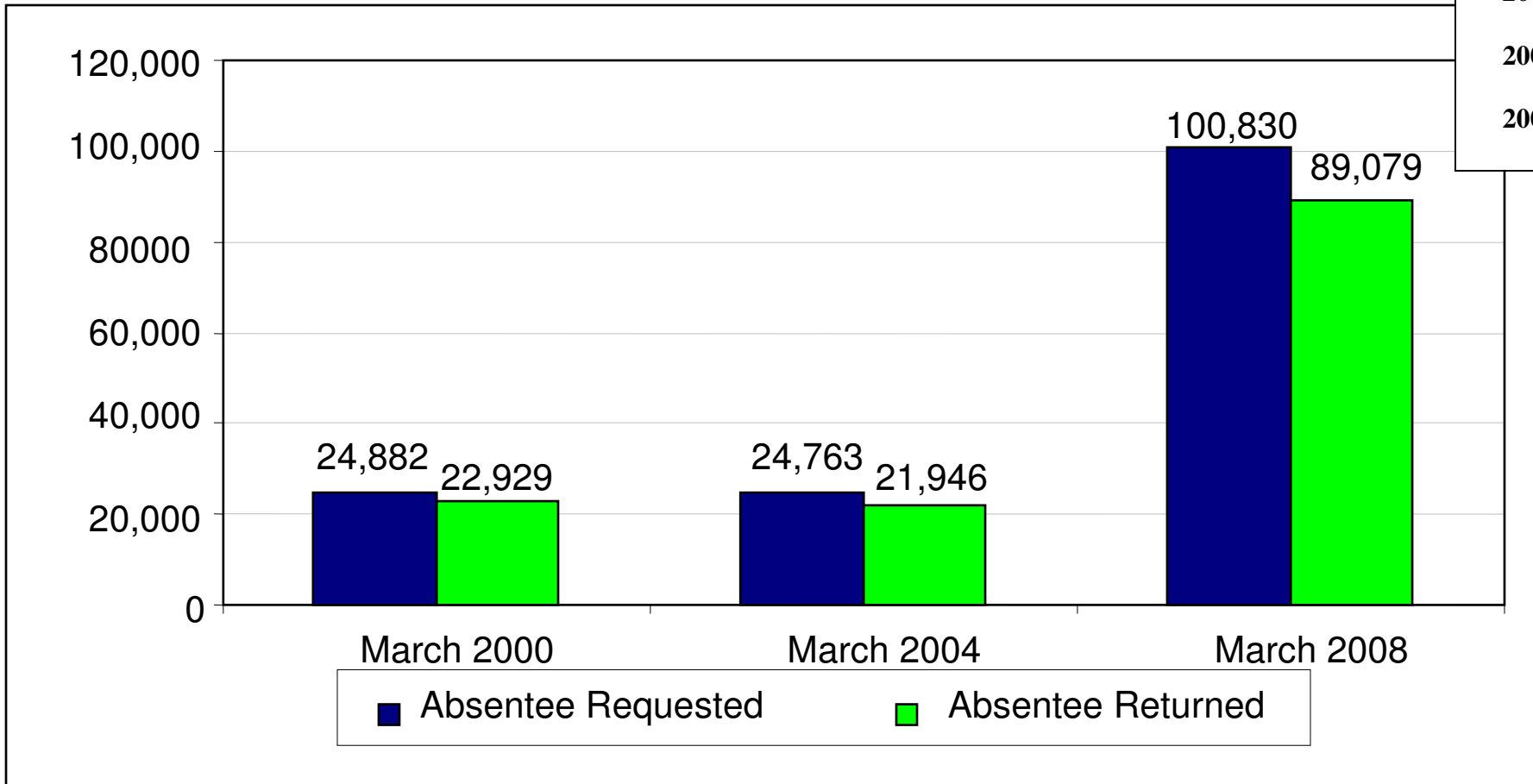
**Historic Perspective:
